



DOGS NSW® International Royal Canin Spring Fair 2023

committee will conduct three All Breeds Championship Shows over the three days, with each Show having unique requirements. To assist exhibitors, especially if you are entering the weekend for the first time, we have prepared the following information which hopefully will make entering and understanding each show easy. DOGS NSW® / Dogs Australia / F.C.I. C.A.C.I.B. SHOWS

Under the Dogs Australia / FCI Agreement of 2017, C.A.C.I.B. Shows in Australia are slightly different to overseas. Therefore, you need to be familiar with the rules for the conduct of a C.A.C.I.B. Show in Australia

What Class Can I Enter?

You may enter the age eligible class (1/1A, 3/3A, 5/5A, 6/6A, 7/7A) regardless of whether you are a Champion or not. Conversely, if your exhibit is a Champion, you enter the Champion Class (8/8A) or the age eligible class.

Please note that, at this show Class 7/7A – Open – is only available “for dogs 15 months and over that are not Champions”

[To be eligible for a CACIB the dog must be over 15 months of age](#)

What Is The Order Of Judging?

The order of judging is similar to a normal show with the only difference being the grading of dogs by the Judge. All the class winners’ return to the ring and the CC is awarded. This is when the C.A.C.I.B. & Junior C.A.C.I.B. may also be awarded. The C.A.C.I.B. award goes no further than dog and bitch. Judging for Best of Breed and beyond is the same as a normal show.

F.C.I. ASIA, AFRICA & OCEANIA CHAMPION TITLE

The DOGS NSW® International Royal Canin Spring Fair 2023 show on Saturday 2nd September 2023 is approved as an official FCI A20 Show and is eligible to award A20 CAC’s. (Challenge Certificates). Many FCI countries around the world award ‘Regional Titles’, for example in the FCI Americas Section there are regional titles such as Pan American Champion and Latin America Champion. The regional Australian FCI title is the Asia, Africa & Oceania Champion, in the short form FCI A20 Champion (FCI A20 Ch.), which came into effect 17th June 2019.

Awarding Of A20cs CAC’s

The A20CS CAC’s are awarded to the Best Dog & Best Bitch OR Dog CAC & Bitch CAC at a Championship Show. The Show does not have to be a CACIB/International Show and the awarding of the A20CS CAC’s follow the Dogs Australia Rules with regard to the Best Dog & Best Bitch OR Dog CAC & Bitch CAC.

CRUFT’S QUALIFYING SHOW

Each State in Australia has a nominated Show which is a “Cruft’s” Qualifying Show for overseas entrants. In New South Wales, the nominated Show is the DOGS NSW® International Royal Canin Spring Fair Show scheduled for Sunday 3rd September 2023. To gain the qualification you must be awarded either the Dog Challenge Certificate or the Bitch Challenge Certificate or be awarded 1st place in either the Junior Dog Class or the Junior Bitch Class. Qualifying certificates, in pdf format, will be emailed on request, following the show.
